MLA Water Quality Initiative

- Water quality testing program: since 2001
- Samples collected: May, June, July, August
- Analysed mainly for Total Phosphorus
- Some areas tested: total coliforms and *E. coli*
- Data reviewed, reported by Beacon Environmental
- Full report: www.mla.on.ca



Within North Lake Joe samples are collected in four main areas

- Lake Joseph main basin
- 2. Gordon Bay
- 3. Stanley Bay
- 4. Hamer Bay





District Municipality of Muskoka Lake System Health Water Quality Program

- In conjunction with MECP, DMM has undertaken a monitoring program since 1980
- Total of 193 sites on 164 lakes monitored on a rotational basis

- Seguin has contracted testing of two sites on Lake Joseph and one on Lake Rosseau








Total Phosphorous Not Stressed





Lakes in Muskoka today have appoximately 3 weeks less winter ice cover than in 1975.

Summer water temperatures in Muskoka's lakes are 0.5 °C warmer on average than in 1980.

What should you do to quality of water high?

- Maintain a natural shoreline don't clear shrubs and trees away
 - Avoids runoff from soil
 - (and keeps geese of your lawn & rocks)
- Avoid fertilizers & phosphates (nutrients for algae)
- Be kind to your septic. Do not overload and get it checked every 3 to 5 years.
- Get involved: Join the team to help with water testing or the new benthic testing programs



Benthic Monitoring Program

- Benthic invertebrates are a good measure of lake health. Many lake associations are participating.
- The DMM Biological Monitoring Program staff by providing expertise, training and equipment.
- About 5 volunteers are needed for about 3 hrs 1 or 2 x per summer along with 1 person who will act as a lead for the project.

- Investigate other water quality and lake monitoring initiatives presently underway by various agencies

Municipal Update

Introduction

- LJNA represents the interest of shoreline residents on the Seguin Twp section of Lake Joseph and Portage Lake
- Most of LJNA is in Ward 4 but some are in Ward 3
- Municipal matters are an important part of LJNA's mandate. We advocate for fair taxes and reasonable development, and bring a voice to Council on issues that matter to our members.



This Past Year

- Municipal election: Assessed candidates & Campaign to "get the vote out", hosted All Candidate Meeting.
- Submissions on two key zoning by-law applications
 - Richards Bay & Glenn Burney Lodge
- Developed draft criteria and procedures to help us approach these decisions in a consistent, reasonable and defendable way.
- Provided input to draft Strategic Plan and began preparing for the upcoming OP review.



Next 12 months

- Continue to evaluate & participate in priority bylaw amendment applications
- Actively participate in Official Plan review:
 - It is an overarching policy document to be reviewed every 5 yrs.
 - It is our opportunity to suggest improvements
 - We are working on a process to get your input: what is "reasonable development" for our shoreline properties?

- Collaborate with neighbouring associations:
 Seguin Associations Meetings
- Communication with neighbouhoods affected by new applications
- Attendance at council meetings when possible
